Thank You Very Much for coming out to enjoy our track day. The 10/10ths goal is for you to have a great time, learn some HPDE skills and most of all; go home safe and sound. There are things we can do to help ensure this, but as a driver, you have the ability to help us meet these goals as well.

Some things every driver can do to make this happen.

Schedule: • Be (

- Be on time for registration
 - We have a lot of drivers to register; being on time is a great way to keep us on schedule. The sooner you register, the better the morning will be.
- Be on time for the drivers meeting.
 - We have some essential information that everyone must hear. Please be on time for this meeting.
- Be ready and in your car at least 5 minutes before each session.

Documentation:

• Have your tech sheet and waiver filled out <u>Before</u> you come to registration. Not having the proper documents ready is the largest registration bottleneck and slows the entire process down.

On Track:

This is without question, where every driver can make an impact on the overall event success. We are all here to get track time and have fun doing it. These are things you can do to help.

- SPORTSMANSHIP, SPORTSMANSHIP and more SPORTSMANSHIP
 - I believe this to be the single most important aspect very driver needs to bring to the event. Adhere to the rules and everyone has a better time, especially you. Leave the ego at home. Being passed etc. is just part of the sport and will add to your learning curve.
- Situational awareness
 - Always know what is around you while on track and plan ahead for passing and being passed.
- Blend Line
 - Obey the blend line, every time, at every track, even if you are the first person out.
- Point Byes
 - The car that is coming up on you is there for a reason. He/she is faster on track. Just point them bye and learn by watching their line etc. There is absolutely no shame in pointing someone bye but plenty of potential problems for those that don't and form trains.
 - o Give full, arm out the window point-byes, one for each car
- Pit in
 - Give a full arm out and up with a closed fist at least one turn before pit in. Keep it out and up until you enter the
 pit lane and <u>never</u> change your mind once you give the signal.
- Car Readiness
 - Prepare your car as best you can. We understand mechanical issues occur but let's try to minimize this. Laying oil etc. down on the track stops the event for everyone until it is cleaned up.
- Know and Obey all flags when on track. This is essential to everyone's safety.
- Wave to the corner workers during your cool down lap. They are there for our safety and it is great to acknowledge their hard work. They are our friends.
- Common courtesy
 - This is important both on track and in the paddock. We have a mix of very experienced drivers all the way down to first timers. Courtesy in all situations will go a very long way towards a great event as well as your reputation at the track.
 - Listen to your instructor and thank them when finished.
 - He/she may tell you things just a bit different from your last instructor but we all have different experiences etc. that you can learn from. They are in the car with you !!! Listen to them and follow directions. If you are uncomfortable with something, let them know and don't drive above your ability.

Most of all, be safe and have fun. This is a great sport and an even greater bunch of people.
